What's MyZone?

MyZone is the name of the public transport fare system encompassing travel by train, bus (government and private), government ferry and light rail. MyZone tickets are used across greater Sydney, the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, the Illawarra, the Southern Highlands and the Hunter (excluding Newcastle Ferries and Newcastle Buses time-based fares).

This brochure is designed to help you work out which MyZone ticket you need for your journey.

More than one mode, or light rail	MyMulti or Family Funday Sunday or Pensioner Excursion ticket	A MyMulti ticket gives you unlimited travel on government and private buses, government ferries and light rail, plus travel in up to three different train zones (see pages 8-9). Eligibility conditions apply to Family Funday Sunday and Pensioner Excursion tickets (see pages 14-15).
Bus	MyBus or MyMulti	MyBus tickets are valid on both government and private buses. There are three different fares, based on the number of sections passed through on your journey (see page 3).
Ferry	MyFerry or MyMulti	MyFerry tickets are valid on Sydney Ferries. There are two different fares, based on distance.
Train	MyTrain or MyMulti	MyTrain tickets are valid for travel from one CityRail station to another, not for zones. There are five different fares, based on distance.

Before choosing your train, bus or ferry ticket, please consider whether a MyMulti ticket may provide you with even greater value and flexibility (see pages 6 - 7).

MyBus tickets (bus-only travel)

How do I know which is the right bus ticket?

Select a MyBus1, MyBus2 or MyBus3 ticket according to how many sections you need to travel through on your trip (a section is approximately 1.6 km).

If you are unsure of the number of sections you need to travel, here is a rough guide:*

MyBus1: for a short trip of up to 3 km approximately.

MyBus2: for a trip of up to 8 km approximately.

MyBus3: for a trip over 8 km.

* This is a rough guide only, and you should check the exact number of sections for your journey with your bus company or call Transport Info on **131 500**.

MyBus tickets are valid on private and government buses (excluding Newcastle Buses).

Each bus ride counts as one trip and you will need a ticket for each bus you ride on.

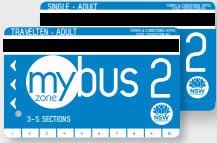
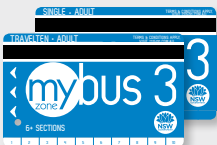
This means that if you're travelling with a MyBus TravelTen ticket, you must validate your ticket every time you change buses, however existing transfer rules apply.

Handy Tips

- ▶ TravelTen tickets represent up to 20% savings compared to single tickets (10 rides for the price of 8). TravelTens do not expire until all 10 rides are used.
- ▶ Dip your MyBus TravelTen in the green machine on government buses, or present your ticket to the driver on private buses.

MyMulti tickets (combined train, bus, ferry and light rail travel)

All MyMulti tickets give you unlimited travel on all government and private buses[▫], government ferries and light rail services across the network, as well as train travel. There are three different train zones and the area of train coverage required will determine which MyMulti ticket best suits your needs. Train station boundaries are listed below, alternatively see the map on pages 8-9 to check which MyMulti train zone your station is in.

Handy Tips

- MyMulti tickets purchased from ticket resellers or Sydney Buses TransitShops are valid from the date of first use.
- MyMulti tickets purchased from CityRail stations or Sydney Ferries wharves are valid from the date of purchase.
- MyMulti tickets may be printed on train, bus or ferry ticket stock and therefore may not be as per the colour or design shown below.
- MyMulti tickets are not sold on board Metro Light Rail, so you'll need to buy one from a MyZone ticket reseller before boarding.
- To see where you could travel on Sydney Ferries or Metro Light Rail, see the network maps on pages 16 - 17.

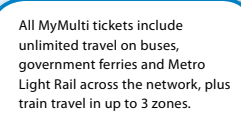

MyFerry tickets (ferry-only travel)

Select a MyFerry1 or a MyFerry2 ticket according to whether each single trip is under or over 9km. If your ferry journey requires a transfer at Circular Quay, you will need a separate ticket for each leg of the journey.

See page 16 for the Sydney Ferries network map.

Handy Tips

- MyFerry tickets are valid from the day of issue (except those purchased at external ticket resellers, which are valid from the date of first use).
- MyFerry return tickets are available at ticket windows and are equivalent to the price of two single tickets.
- If you travel by ferry every weekday, you may find that a MyMulti is the best value ticket for you (see pages 6 – 7).

MyTrain tickets (train-only travel)

Just ask at your CityRail station for the relevant ticket to your destination station.

MyTrain tickets are only available at CityRail stations. Discounted Monthly, Quarterly and Yearly tickets are also available online at www.131500.com.au or www.cityrail.info

Handy Tips

- ▶ MyTrain tickets are valid from the date of purchase.
- ▶ Get an extra day's travel, free. Buy your Weekly or Fortnightly ticket after 3.00pm to get travel for the rest of the day, plus a further seven or 14 days.

What's a Pensioner Excursion ticket and who can use one?

Pensioner Excursion tickets are available to holders of Pensioner Concession Cards, Seniors Cards and NSW and Victorian War Widow/er Concession Cards. When travelling on a Pensioner Excursion Ticket, you must carry your concession card for ID purposes.

If you have one of these concession cards, you are eligible for all-day unlimited travel with a Pensioner Excursion ticket, for just \$2.50, on all Metro Light Rail services*, government buses, trains and government ferries, and participating private bus services across the network. This includes the Sydney metropolitan and outer metropolitan areas - Newcastle, the Lower Hunter, the Central Coast, the Blue Mountains, Lithgow and the Illawarra.

Where can I buy a Pensioner Excursion ticket?

Pensioner Excursion tickets can be purchased at any time of the day from CityRail stations, on board Sydney Buses (excluding PrePay only services or services from PrePay only bus stops) and Newcastle Buses, participating private bus operators, from Sydney Ferries ticket offices (or staff on board some services), and Newcastle Ferries ticket offices, for travel on the day of purchase only.

You can also purchase Pensioner Excursion tickets in advance from selected ticket resellers, including many newsagents and convenience stores (look for the MyZone/PrePay flag).

Please note that Pensioner Excursion tickets are not sold on board Metro Light Rail, so you will need to buy one from a ticket reseller before you board.

Family Funday Sunday tickets

What's a Family Funday Sunday ticket and who can use one?

A Family Funday Sunday ticket allows you and your family to explore Sydney and surrounds for just \$2.50 per person on a Sunday.

The ticket gives you unlimited travel on Sydney's buses, trains, government ferries and Metro Light Rail services* on any Sunday. The ticket will even take you to Newcastle and Wollongong!

A family must include at least one adult and one child (an eligible child is aged up to 15 yrs, or 16-18 yrs with a valid school travel pass or current NSW Senior Secondary Student Transport Concession card). Children under 4 yrs travel free.

Where can I buy a Family Funday Sunday ticket?

Buy your Family Funday Sunday ticket on Sundays from bus drivers (excluding PrePay services), CityRail stations, ferry ticket offices, or any day of the week from selected ticket resellers, including many newsagents and convenience stores (look for the MyZone/PrePay flag). See the store locator at www.131500.com.au to find your nearest ticket outlet.

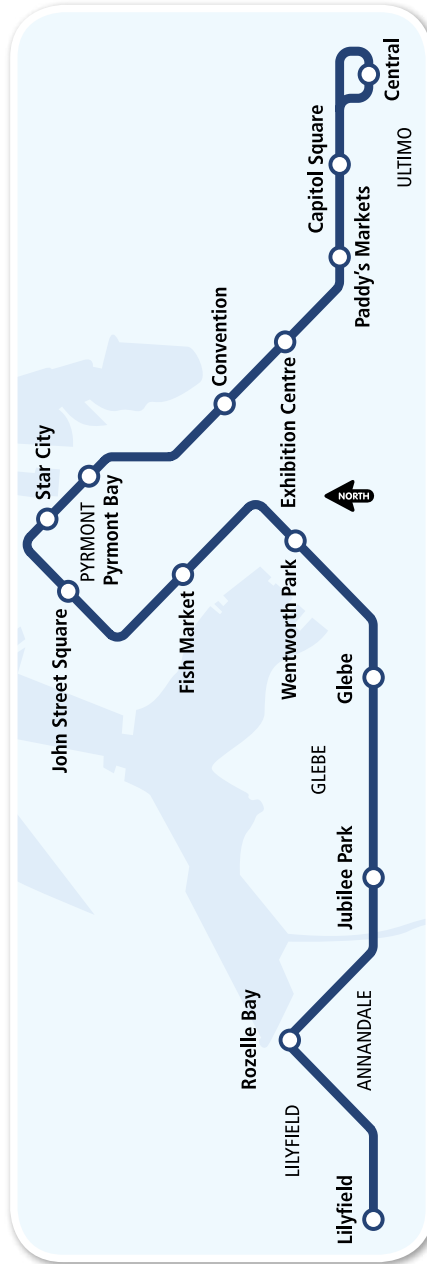
Please note that Family Funday Sunday tickets are not sold on board Metro Light Rail, so you will need to buy them from a MyZone ticket reseller before you board.
